Public consultations are now open for a number of qualifications in the Community Services

Training Package. The Alcohol and Other Drug qualifications are included. The consultation period closes on Friday 9th May, 2014.

This will be the final opportunity to provide input into the structure and content of these qualifications - what results will be with us for the next few years.

There are some significant changes proposed. Key issues for your feedback include:

- Removal of the Diploma of Community Services (Alcohol, other drugs and mental health)
- · Greater flexibility in choice of electives
- Skill sets that might encompass entry level and advanced skill sets
- · The possibility of a comorbidity skill set
- Some new units of competence and several changed units of competence

Support available for community projects in rural, regional & remote communities

The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) is making available small grants of up to \$5000 to not for profit community groups for projects and activities that offer clear public benefit, especially for communities of fewer than 10,000 people.

The funds can go towards projects that improve:

- Health, social welfare and wellbeing;
- Educational opportunities and outcomes;
- · Arts, culture, tourism and heritage projects;
- Environmental and natural resource management outcomes; or
- A community's economic sustainability, through community-led economic and social enterprise activities.

To be eligible projects must address a recognised need in the community and be charitable in their purpose (ie. not of benefit to individuals or on private land).
